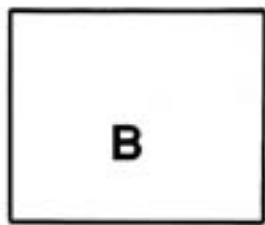


5 basic shapes are needed to create the starter house.

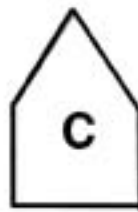
It is called a starter house because it includes the building blocks for much larger projects. For instance the peaked cutters can create the front and back of a country church or the center of a Victorian house.

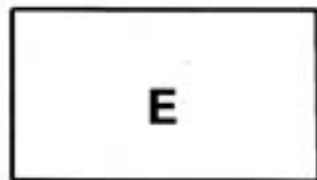

A - 4"W x 5"H x 8" to Peak

B - 6"W x 5"H

C - 3"W x 2¼"H x 4½" to Peak

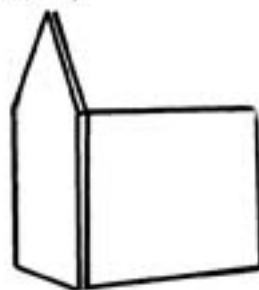
D - 1¼"W x 3" H

E - 7¼"W x 4" H

You will need to cut out 2 each of A, B, C and E, and cut out 6 of D.

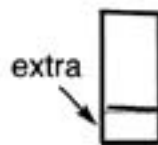
Step #1 Sides & Front

Ice together an A and a B with A on the outside of the B.



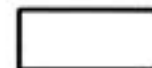
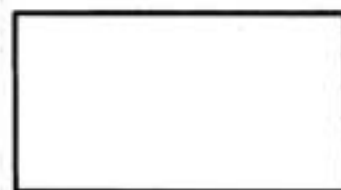
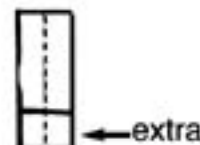
Step #2 Other Side and Back

Repeat Step 1 then ice all four pieces together.



Step #3 Entrance

Using D cut out doorway from C as shown keeping the cutout for your door. Cut 1 D in half from top to bottom, same height as door. Ice to inside of C. Then ice to the front of house.



Step #4 Roofs

Ice 2 E's on roof of house.
Ice 2 D's on roof of entrance.



Step #5 Dormers

Cut Piece C as shown. This will give you the dormer parts. Ice together and place on roof. (You will have 2 pieces left over not used)



Step #6 Chimneys

Cut 3 D pieces in half, then using C piece cut out notch as shown. Ice three together and place on roof.
